Come ready to receive; then let that overflow fuel you for the days ahead. Come prepared to participate, knowing that worshiping together is a rehearsal for heaven. But most importantly? Just come.

## **Annual Conference: Disaffiliation Vote**

The Mississippi Annual Conference (UMC) meets June 27-30 in Tupelo. As part of Annual Conference, the delegates will vote on whether or not to affirm each church's disaffiliation. The Conference vote will be **Wednesday**, **June 28**, **at 9 a.m.** There are around 189 churches that will be voted on that morning, including our church. Each church will be voted on individually. And it takes a simple majority approval from Annual Conference to finalize our church's disaffiliation.

So, please pray for the Annual Conference and the Conference disaffiliation vote, that they will approve our church's disaffiliation as well as the other churches.

Assuming that vote passes, our trustees will meet at the District office on July 5 to sign the final agreement and make the disaffiliation payment. These are the last two steps of our disaffiliation.
