TIPS ON PACKING YOUR SHOE BOX due November 16, 2020. 1. Use new items since used clothing or toys will be discarded. 2. Each box stands alone; so don't divide items between two boxes. 3. Include some fun in each box as this may be the only gift some of these children receive all year. 4. Remove all wrappings from your items as many sites have no place to put trash. 5. A tooth brush may be put in a ziplock bag. No candy or toothpaste as they have a "use by date." 6. Include your \$9.00 check for each box you pack. If you do multiple boxes just write one for all your boxes and place in one of your boxes. You may also go online and use a credit card where you will get a tracking number strip which you can print out and attach to the shoe box. 7. Place the boy/girl strip at the end of the box. Later these boxes will be taped around the middle for shipment.


Sunday Night Youth
